The **Delaware County Black Caucus (DCBC)** continues to make a significant impact in Delaware County through advocacy, community engagement, and strategic initiatives. This annual report outlines key accomplishments, and priorities for the future as we strive to build a stronger, more empowered community in Delaware County.

Impact by the Numbers

- Total Funds Raised in 2024: Over \$10,000 raised in Q4.
- **New Members Gained:** 35 new members welcomed in 2024.
- **Total Membership:** 80+ active members engaged in DCBC initiatives.
- Number of Events Held: 6+ major events, including:
 - Annual Symposium
 - Annual Gala
 - Christmas Give-Away at Wesley House Shelter
 - Penn Wood Middle School Partnership
 - Black Maternal Health Awareness Programs

Current Membership Data

- **Total Active Members:** 80+ active members (35 new members accepted in 2024).
- Year-over-Year Growth: Increased engagement through a structured nomination and vetting process.
- **Membership Drive Initiative:** Launched a nomination-based membership initiative in October 2024.

- Transitioned to an **electronic tracking system** for dues payments, participation, and engagement.
- **Friends of DCBC:** Collaborated with the Fundraising Committee to transition "Friends of DCBC" into a structured **external supporter category.**
- Strengthened **screening and approval procedures** to align with DCBC's mission and values.

Annual Symposium – Focused on **education**, **mental health**, **and gun violence**, featuring expert panels with policy leaders and advocates. (October 2024)

Annual Gala – A key **fundraising event** recognizing outstanding Black leaders and students, fostering community and donor engagement. (November 2024)

Brother to Brother Men's Health Event – Offering health screenings, prostate health panel discussion and a touch of jazz, in partnership with Laborers' 413.. (June 2024)

Community Resource Fair – Served **100+ families**, providing school supplies, health screenings, and access to local resources. (September 2024)

Black Maternal Health Forum – Film screening and panel discussion on the movie "Aftershock" in partnership with State Rep. Gina Curry to address racial disparities in maternal healthcare and connect families to vital resources. (May 2024)

Holiday Giving Initiatives – Hosted a **toy and gift card drive** for unhoused families and organized a **member holiday social** to strengthen engagement and welcome new members.. (December 2024)

Black Excellence Career Expo – Partnered with Penn Wood Middle School, exposing students to professionals in various industries and awarding student achievements. (March 2024)

- Over \$10,000 raised in Q4 2024, with an increase in committee member participation.
- Established relationships with **eight new sponsors** who contributed financially to DCBC.

- Adopted an annual operating budget to effectively disturbed funds
